HISTORY of POST #266

The Erickson Post #3266 was Bennington's first post. First Charter was applied for in August of 1920 with 12 Veterans listed. On October 29, 1920, there were 19 Veterans listed on the permanent Charter. Apparently the Post did not remain active as it was rechartered on January 15, 1947 with 22 names and a name change to the Bennington Legion, with Tim Ohrt as Commander. The Bennington American Legion Auxiliary was Chartered in April of 1962 with 13 members. Currently there are more than 100 Senior and Junior members.

The Legion acquired the Post Home from the Modern Woodmen of American after they disbanded their Unit here in Bennington. The Hall was modernized beginning in the late 1950's or early 1960's in steps to reach our present building.

A sign honoring those who served in the military from this community during World War II is located in front of the Legion Hall. It was originally located on the corner of Centennial Park at Warehouse Street and 156 Street and purchased by the Bennington Women's Club. Those lost in Action are noted on the sign with a gold star.

Both the Legion and the Auxiliary work for the needs of the Veterans, his/her family, children and youth, and to promote Americanism.

BRICK CLUB

Engraved bricks are being sold and will be set in a pathway leading to a monument honoring all Veterans from all branches of the United States Military in this area from the past, present and future. Bricks can be purchased by non-veteran families to honor any family member or friend. Red bricks will be used for Veterans and gray bricks for non-veterans and sponsors.

Step 3 - Pick a size: 4" x 8", 8" x 16", 16" x 16"


